Day 1: Saturday, September 5, 2026 Overnight Flight Ciao, Italy!

Day 2: Sunday, September 6, 2026 Rome, Italy Welcome to the "Eternal City" of Rome. As arrival times will vary, there is no scheduled sightseeing today. Spend the day as you wish, exploring the city independently. Tonight, join your fellow travelers for a welcome dinner featuring regional delicacies and Italian wines. (*D*)

Day 3: Monday, September 7, 2026 Rome This morning, discover Italy's capital city during an extensive walking tour. Visit the Colosseum,* where your guide recounts its rich history. Meander through Rome's Renaissance district for a peek at the mythic Pantheon and the oval-shaped Piazza Navona, adorned with Baroque fountains. Spend the evening at leisure. Perhaps you'll head to the medieval *Monti* neighborhood where cobblestoned streets are lined with antique shops, independent boutiques and local restaurants. *(B)*

Day 4: Tuesday, September 8, 2026 Rome Today you will visit The Vatican Museums, they are not only home to one of the world's greatest collections of art, but also to the world-famous Sistine Chapel. Priceless artifacts from ancient Egypt, Etruscan Italy, and cultures around the world are preserved in the Vatican's palaces, galleries, halls, and rooms. Follow a local expert guide on a three hour, in-depth visit through this vast collection. Highlights include the Gallery of Maps, the Gallery of Tapestries and, of course, a visit to the Sistine Chapel. The chapel's famous ceiling frescoes took Michelangelo four years to complete. His brilliant Last Judgment, which rests on the altar wall, was a topic of controversy for centuries. Other walls feature paintings by Pietro Perugino, Sandro Botticelli, Cosimo Rosselli, and Domenico Ghirlandaio. Your final stop will be at St. Peter's Basilica, one of the most important churches in Christendom, and until recently, the largest in the world. The evening is yours. Perhaps you will join an optional food tour and taste your way around Rome's bohemian Trastevere district. (B)

Day 5: Wednesday, September 9, 2026 Rome - Sorrento

Journey to the brilliant Bay of Naples, where charming villages are built into hillsides above the blue sea. Along the way, pause in nearby Gragnano for a lunch and visit to a pasta factory. Continue to the scenic resort town of Sorrento, where you'll enjoy free time to explore before settling in for a two-night stay in a hotel located either in Sorrento or along its picturesque coast***. (*B*, *L*)

Day 6: Thursday, September 10, 2026 Sorrento Today, sail to the enchanting Isle of Capri.**** Upon arrival, admire the island's iconic scenery on a panoramic cruise,**** passing by the steep cliffs, endless small caves, and the famous Faraglioni rocks, jutting out of the water. Spend time in Capri town with its world-famous *piazzetta* and explore this island paradise of chic boutiques, lush vegetation, and outdoor cafés. Return to the mainland for an evening at leisure. (*B*, *D*)

Day 7: Friday, September 11, 2026 Sorrento - Pompeii - Florence Start your day in Pompeii, where **it's your choice!** Soak in 2,000 years of history at your own pace. Pick between a leisurely paced tour of the highlights **-OR-** a faster paced visit of Pompeii's offthe-beaten-path gems. Spend the rest of the day relaxing on the bus while you head to Tuscany, with its landscape of vineyards and olive groves. Late this afternoon, arrive in Florence, the "Cradle of the Renaissance." Home to Italy's best art and architecture, begin your exploration with an evening stroll to dinner at a local restaurant. (*B, D*)

Day 8: Saturday, September 12, 2026 Florence This morning, embark on a guided walking tour of Florence. Along the way, admire the cathedral's iconic dome and the Baptistery's famous Gates of Paradise. Stroll through the historic Piazza della Signoria and stand in awe before the imposing Palazzo Vecchio. This evening, set off on a scenic drive to nearby Galluzzo, famous for its Carthusian monastery which rests upon one of the beautiful hills surrounding Florence. Prior to dinner, enjoy an after-hours visit to this 14th-century monastery – La Certosa.* Revel in the beauty that lurks inside and experience the monastery's magnificence as you learn about monastic daily life. Then your evening of fun

Day 9: Sunday, September 13, 2026 Florence - Pisa - Venice Visit the ancient maritime Republic of Pisa to discover the Piazza dei Miracoli and the famous Leaning Tower. A special stop is made at a Tuscan winery and farm to enjoy lunch and sample local wines and specialties. Next, cross the Apennine Mountains en route to Venice, where 117 islands are connected by a latticework of 150 canals and 400 bridges. (*B, L*)

Day 10: Monday, September 14, 2026 Venice Embark on a boat trip to Murano Island for a glass-blowing demonstration. When you return, step off the beaten path and see for yourself how the locals live. Explore the *Castello* district with a local expert, walking canal by canal through the narrow streets all the way to St. Mark's Square. Admire the stunning Basilica and the ornate façade of the Doge's Palace. This afternoon, experience the romance that can only be found in Venice – La Serenissima – while traveling on its famous waterways. Partake in one of Venice's most famous pastimes – a gondola cruise. Take a pleasant stroll toward the Grand Canal to board your gondola. As you relax in your elegant watercraft, your gondolier navigates the Grand Canal as well as smaller side canals. Admire the scenery as you listen to the melodic voice serenading you in true Italian style – just like in those romantic Italian movies! *(B)*

Day 11: Tuesday, September 15, 2026 Venice - Verona - Stresa, Lake Maggiore Depart Venice for Verona and stroll the streets that were the backdrop for Shakespeare's *Romeo and Juliet.* Arrive in the resort town of Stresa in the breathtaking Italian Lakes District, your home for the next two nights, and admire the beautiful views of Lake Maggiore. (*B, D*)

Day 12: Wednesday, September 16, 2026 Stresa Today, **it's your choice!** Take a boat across Lake Maggiore to Isola Bella, where you'll join an expert guide and venture into the Borromeo Palace and gardens***** **-OR-** cross into Switzerland as your motor coach climbs up the Simplon Pass for a taste of the Swiss Alps. Enjoy an afternoon at leisure in Stresa, a town long-favored by European aristocracy because of its blend of elegant belle-époque mansions, fragrant gardens and charming views. Tonight, travel by boat to Isola dei Pescatori***** for a farewell dinner surrounded by beautiful scenery. (*B, D*)

Day 13: Thursday, September 17, 2026 Stresa - Tour Ends Your Italian adventure comes to a close today, depart with wonderful classic memories you will carry with you for a lifetime. *(B)*

The overall activity level of this tour is a level 3. This means you're an on-the-go traveler. You don't want to miss a thing, so walking and standing for longer periods of time (2-3 hours) isn't a big deal. A moderately paced two-and-a-half-hour walking tour, covering several miles, hills, and uneven surfaces, is no problem for you. Walking four miles over the course of a day is very doable, as is climbing into and out of various modes of transportation (tuk-tuk, cable car, zodiac, etc.). You can climb three flights of stairs easily and handle altitudes between 6,000 and 9,000 feet. Expect some longer days with early mornings or late nights balanced with free time to recharge or set out on your own adventure. This level is not a fit for travelers who require mobility assistance devices.

Travel with an average of 37 people (maximum of 44).

The archeological site of Pompeii is entirely pedestrianized, and the only access is via a steep ancient Roman street which is uphill and paved with large, slippery cobblestones. Therefore, the site is not "accessible" for those with mobility issues. Throughout the archeological site, you will need to navigate large cobblestones and steep sidewalks. There are no vehicles inside the site, which is extremely vast.

In Florence, you must be prepared to stand on your feet and walk for 3 hours with only 1 restroom stop. There is no seating available during the walking tour. You will be walking around very crowded areas. The streets are cobblestoned, with narrow sidewalks. Some streets are pedestrianized but many others allow cars, motorbikes, and small public transportation vehicles. To complete your sightseeing tour, you should expect to walk a minimum of 1.4 miles (2.3 km), plus 1.1 miles (1.7 km) to return to the hotel at the end of the guided tour.

The ferry boat trip to the isle of Capri is dependent on sea and wind conditions and may depart from Sorrento or Naples, with the length of the sailing varying between 30 and 50 minutes each way. This full day excursion requires using small minibuses to shuttle from the hotel to the port of Sorrento for your ferry boat ride to Capri. There is limited seating on the minibuses, which cannot be reserved, so you must be prepared to ride standing up and holding on to handrails as the vehicles travel the narrow, winding road to the port of Sorrento. While the ride is under 5 minutes, upper body strength is required for your safety.

Venice is not accessible to vehicles and requires navigating large crowds, narrow streets, and climbing over multiple bridges with steps up and down. The included sightseeing will take place with a mix of motorboat and walking. There will be 3 motorboat rides, each of 20-30 minutes. The walking tour requires the ability to walk and stand for 90 minutes, covering approximately 1.2 miles (1.9 km) and climb up and down approximately 100 steps. Agility is required to board the gondola boats if participating in the optional tour.

To complete the full day walking tour of Rome and Colosseum visit, you must be able to walk and stand on your feet for a total of 4 hours with a lunch break of about 60 minutes in between. There is NO seating available during the tour, not even at the Colosseum. Expect to be walking a minimum of 2.2 miles (3.6 km) during the day and climb up and down approximately 200 steps (100 during the walking tour and 100 inside the Colosseum).

Italy imposes strict limits on tour bus circulation, and mandatory drop off and pick up points, especially in historic areas such as Rome, Sorrento, Positano and Amalfi. The same applies for the optional tour sightseeing outlined in the itinerary. All these areas require navigating large crowds, extensive walking over cobblestones, uneven and often narrow sidewalks, and occasionally unpaved terrain with loose gravel.

To complete the optional visit of the Vatican Museum and St. Peter's Basilica you must be able to walk and stand on your feet for a total of 5 hours with only 1 break (approximately 20 minutes). There is NO seating available during the tour and no air conditioning in the Museum, which is often overcrowded. The amount of walking varies according to the crowds on the day of your visit, but you must expect to be walking a minimum distance of 2.6 miles (4.2 km) in addition to climbing down about 120 steps to exit the Vatican Museum and up another 30 steps to reach St. Peter's Basilica.

Once on Capri, you will transfer to a smaller boat for a panoramic sailing of the island, boarding via a gangplank that has railings but may move around due to waves. Back on the island, you will use a mix of local transportation to reach Capri village, which may include the funicular and/or minibuses. In the case of minibuses, there will be limited seating, and you may have to stand with the use of handrails while the vehicle winds its way up and down from the port to Capri village. In both cases, you must be prepared to stand in line for 10-30 minutes with no seating or shelter as you wait for transportation. Travelers prone to motion sickness or seasickness should take proper precautions.

Even though tickets have been pre-booked to enter the Colosseum, you must be prepared to stand in line for up to 15-30 minutes, without shelter or seating. You will go through an airport-style security check. Once inside, you will have to climb 25 steps to gain access to the first level from which there is a view of the arena. Please note that these steps are about 20 inches tall (50 cm) and that there are NO handrails. There is a total of 100 of these tall steps to climb to the top level. While there is an elevator inside the site, its use is reserved to people with disabilities and therefore not accessible to our groups.

The included activities are not suitable for travelers using motorized scooters, wheelchairs, walkers, or Zimmer-frames.

If you require any special assistance while on tour, please make us aware at time of reservation so the necessary request form can be sent to your attention.

For your comfort, we recommend bringing comfortable walking shoes.

This comprehensive tour features multiple long bus transfers exceeding 3 hours. In particular, the transfer from Rome to Sorrento requires 4+ hours of driving. The fullday transfer from Sorrento to Florence entails 7+ hours of driving, and the transfers from Florence to Venice and from Venice to Stresa both exceed 5 hours of driving.

Please note that most shops and businesses in Italy and Switzerland are closed on Sundays and on national/religious holidays.

*The Colosseum dates and times are all subject to change based on availability of reservations.

****Your boat trip to Capri may not be available due to inclement weather. If this happens, we will make alternate sightseeing arrangements. In case the scenic boat ride around the Isle of Capri cannot operate, you will visit Anacapri village instead.

*****Isola Bella and the Borromeo Palace & Gardens are open from March 15 to October 31 (tough there are small differences every year based on when the closest weekend falls). If you are travelling between November 1 and March 14, you will enjoy a scenic cruise of the Borromean Islands and a visit to Pallanza village instead. If you are in Lake Maggiore between March 15 and April 15 the Borromeo Palace might be closed mid-week.

******In the event of adverse weather conditions, the dinner at Pescatori island may be held at your hotel instead.

Most museums in Florence are closed on Mondays, including the Academy Gallery and the Uffizi. Most museums in Florence require reservations to access. In order to reduce queuing, we suggest you reserve your ticket online prior to departure if you plan to visit the Academy Gallery or the Uffizi during your free time in Florence. On the day you transfer to Florence, you can expect to arrive at the hotel around 4:30 p.m. The following day, you can expect your included tour of Florence to conclude by 1:00 p.m.

If booking tickets for one of the above museums, allow yourselves 30 minutes to reach them from your hotel and/or the end point of your walking tour.

**Due to the unpredictable nature of the events schedule at the Vatican, on certain dates it may be necessary to visit the Vatican Museums at a different time or even on a different day. For example, when the Vatican option falls on a Wednesday, the order of included and optional tour days may be reversed. The Vatican Museum is closed on most Sundays and on all Catholic holidays. There is no air conditioning in the museum.

**The optional tour to the Vatican Museums and St. Peter's Basilica must be booked at least 90 days prior to departure and is not guaranteed while on tour.

Modest dress (covering your knees and shoulders for women and long trousers for men) is required when visiting religious sites, sanctuaries, basilicas, etc.

Hotel check-in on your day of arrival is 3:00 p.m. Rooms may not be available prior to that time.

***On occasion your hotel may be located in one of Sorrento's neighboring towns or in a scenic location along the coast.
